(7)	Although the United States spends more on healthcare than any other country in the world, the U.S. maternal mortality rate is higher than any other developed country and is on the rise. Based on the personal stories presented in the <i>Giving Birth in America</i> documentary series, describe in your own words two factors that may contribute to the rising U.S. maternal mortality rate. Please write complete sentences. (10 points)	One factor is that almost everyone in the United States gives birth in a hospital. Despite advanced medical technology, it can sometimes be unnecessary and potentially endanger the patient or child. Another factor is that doctors may opt for the more straightforward solution; if a birth becomes complicated, they often perform a C-section, which has become common practice. In other places where midwives are more prevalent, midwives do everything they can before sending the mother to seek medical care.	
(8)	Based on what you've learned in this module, how might the medicalization of birth contribute to childbirth complications and the rising maternal mortality rate in the U.S.? Please write complete sentences. (5 points)	Since the United States spends so much on medical care for childbirth, only a tiny fraction of births occur at home or through midwives. In other countries where midwives and home births are more common, there is a decrease in maternal mortality.
