Lastly, setting priorities involves addressing her most life-threatening issues first, such as her potential respiratory infection."

"Implementing planned interventions—Given Mindy's current state, personalized care adjustments are necessary, particularly in administering medications and oxygen therapy. Regarding delegation, tasks such as routine monitoring can be assigned to nursing assistants, ensuring I follow up regularly. Communication is key; I need to update the healthcare team

about her status changes and potential risks. Lastly, educating Mindy and her family about her care plan, warning signs to watch for, and the importance of mobility to aid her recovery is essential."
