THE CONCEPT OF FEDERALISM



Division of power between national and state governments



Balances authority and prevents tyranny



Encourages policy innovation at state levels



Promotes political participation at local levels



Significant in understanding state vs. federal roles



THE PRINCIPLE OF CHECKS AND BALANCES

- Ensures no branch of government becomes too powerful
- Legislative, Executive, and Judicial branches have distinct powers
- Each branch can limit the powers of the others
- Promotes accountability and prevents abuse of power
- Crucial for maintaining democratic governance

THE IMPORTANCE OF CIVIL LIBERTIES

- •Protection of individual rights and freedoms
- •Enshrined in the Bill of Rights
- •Limits government interference in personal lives
- •Ensures freedom of speech, religion, and press
- •Fundamental to a free and democratic society



VOTING AS A CIVIC DUTY

- •Central to democratic participation
- •Allows citizens to influence government policies
- •Reflects public opinion and societal values
- •Promotes accountability of elected officials
- •Essential for the legitimacy of the political system




ENGAGING IN POLITICAL DISCUSSIONS
